

Minutes of the A.G.M. held at
The Railway Hotel on SATURDAY 8th APRIL 1967 @ 8.30 hrs.

The chair was taken by Mr. S. Porcher, one of the Clubs Vice Presidents. Mr. Porcher said that he was pleased to perform this duty but was more than sorry that due to ill health the President, Mr. K. L. Dames was unable to be present. Mr. Porcher then welcomed all present and commented that although the School Building had vanished the memory will still live on. Then Mr. Porcher introduced a tape recorded message from Mr. K. L. Dames which the secretary had obtained a few weeks earlier. Mr. Dames spoke of his illness and his wife's devotion and completed with drinking the health of all Old Harlovians present at the Meeting.

The Secretary in his report stated that although there had been no events, he had kept in close touch with Mr. Dames, exchanging Old Harlovians news and obtained a taped message to be played at the A.G.M.

The Treasurer's report showed a healthy balance of £198-5-1. Matters arising from the report brought comments from several members that ~~the~~ Clubs various Bank

accounts should now be consolidated to simplify matters. This was proposed by P. Stratton and 2nd by R. Crousell. It was then proposed by J. Jones and 2nd R. Minall that after consolidating the accounts any amount over £100 in the current account should be transferred to the Guardian Building Society.
