

## OLD HARLOVIANS CLUB

MINUTES OF THE 1983 A.C.M. HELD AT THE  
SWAN RESTAURANT BISHOPS STORFORD 7. MAY 1983.

The meeting was attended by forty four members (the largest gathering since 1976), apologies for absence were received from thirteen members. In his opening address, the President Mr S Porcher said that he was pleased to welcome several Old Boys attending for the first time. The minutes of the 1982 meeting were taken as read. The Secretary reported that the notice of the A.C.M. placed in the personal column of the Daily Telegraph had not been a success ~~and~~ as it had only put the Club in touch with two Old Boys. The Treasurer then read his report, the year's accounts were available for inspection. There was some discussion of the future of the War Memorial Fund and <sup>it</sup> was decided a committee meeting should decide its future. and the availability of cash for the purchase of a new stock of ties. When the question of the election of officers and committee arose John Hockley said he thought it would make a welcome change ~~it~~ if they had a chance to state if they wished to stand for re-election. and not be 'bull doxed' into standing for another year. The secretary's plea that it was time a new secretary was elected fell on deaf ears, it was proposed that he should stay in office by approx 22 members and seconded by the remaining 22. It was decided a new Treasurer should be elected. Graham Peacock had indicated that he would be willing to accept the position. This appointment was proposed by S Porcher and seconded by J. Jones. Three new committee members were elected, John Hockley, proposed R. Minall, sec. J. Goulds: Tony Cook, prop. I. Taylor, sec. J. Jones: Alan Careless, prop. S Porcher, sec. M. Careless. Regarding Vice Presidents, a complete list of those elected was not available, the Secretary had not received any records and no vice presidents

had been elected during his term of office. The President assured the meeting that G. Clarke, J. Chivers, D. Palmer, A. ~~Eastwood~~, J. ~~Smith~~ & J. Jones were vice Presidents. R.J.M. Coleman M.C. Claydon.

Norman Pegrum made a suggestion that should the proposed development of St Johns by Harlow Chorus go ahead, the Club should endeavour to have some record of the Church's past association with the College incorporated in the building.

R. Jefferies asked if it were possible that he could have the Mile Cup which he had won on three occasions. This would have to be decided by the committee.

The meeting closed at 10.10.

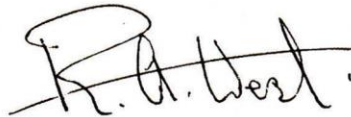

COMMITTEE MEETING 14 SEPT. 1983

Minutes of a committee meeting held at 18 Burnett Park, Harlow. Present. S. Porcher, G. Peacock, R West, J. Foulds, R. Pyle, M. Slater, A. Careless, C Porcher.

Graham Peacock outlined the financial situation of the Club and answered queries raised.

It was proposed that the following accounts should be closed, current account with Nat. West. Bishops Stortford deposit account with Barclays Old Harlow, share account with Guardian Building Society. The contents of these accounts to be transferred to a current account with Nat. West. at Winchmore Hill and a deposit account opened, with the same Bank for cash not required in current account.
