MINUTES OF THE 1984 A & M HELD AT THE SWAN
RESTAURANT BISHOPS STORTFORD 12 MAY 1984

The meeting was attended by thirty eight members, apologies for absence were received from nineteen members. The minutes of the 1983 meeting were read and taken as such. The Treasurer, Graham Pearce made his report. Assets of the Club (Bank, Building Soc., War Stock and Ties) were £446.75, Secretarys expenses still to be paid. The assets of the Old Harlovians War Memorial Fund (Bank account and War Stock Investment) were £108.58. It was yet to be decided what & how this asset was to be utilised, the matter would be dealt with in Committee and it was hoped a favourable report would be made at the next A. & M. Report accepted, proposed M. Slater, Sec. W. Billing. The President thanked Graham Pearce for his efforts during the year, to gain control of the War Mem. Fund. Election of officers, re elected en bloc. M. Slater proposed that a donation be made to the Cancer Research Fund in Memory of Len Taylor. This met with unanimous approval, Tony Cook proposed a collection on the spot and Graham Pearce suggested a donation from the Club to match the collection. The collection produced £42.25, W. Billing proposed the Club should make this amount up to £75.00, seconded by C. Tucker.

A.O.B. Robert Collins suggested some form of table plan could be an advantage for future dinners to enable members to converse with a wider range of members. The Meeting closed at 10.15.



COMMITTEE MEETING

13 MARCH 1984.

Meeting held at Winstory Park Farm, Epping.
Present, S. Porcher, R. Pyle, C. Hockley, G. Peacock,
J. Ludds, A. Cowless & R. West.

Minutes of last committee meeting, 14 Sept 1983, read and agreed. Matters arising concerned various bank accounts; Graham Peacock informed the meeting that the Nat. West, Bishop's Stortford, account and the Barclays, Old Herts, account were now transferred to Nat. West, Winchmore Hill. New club ties had been purchased and the account settled which left the club with a balance of £298.00 made up thus:

The War Memorial account was then discussed at some length, Graham Peacock outlining correspondence with this matter to date. It was agreed that further enquiries should be made to establish whether the War Memorial account was a registered charitable trust as correspondence from the Charity Commissioners had not made this clear.

At the 1983 A.C.M. R. Jeffries had asked if it was possible that he could have possession of the 'Mile Cup' as he had won this cup on three occasions. The committee felt that as in the past cups had only been returned to donors, as agreed at previous A.C.M.'s, the cup should remain in the custody of the club.
