

Minutes of a Committee Meeting Held at
Harlow College on Tuesday 4th February 1958
at 7.45 p.m.

Those Present:- S. Porcher, K.L. James, P. Madsen, M. Norris,
S. Seward, M.C. Paydon - Hon. Sec.

In the absence of Mr. Horsey, our President, it was unanimously agreed that Mr. Porcher take the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and adopted unanimously. There being nothing arising from these minutes the following item in the agenda was then proceeded with.

A letter had been received from Mr. Woods, a club member, complaining that there has been a lack of correspondence involving club activities etc. after a small discussion, this lack of news was put down to bad support from the members of the club. It was proposed by Mr. James and seconded Mr. Norris that in the Autumn an attempt be made to circulate a Newsletter containing news of Old Boys, Cricket and Football Matches and Social Events. This was carried.

With regard to the forthcoming Buffet Dance a discussion was held and the Secretary produced figures regarding replies received from O.H's. It was finally ascertained that approximately 80 people would be able to attend. It was decided that 1 Gross of tickets be ordered and distributed amongst those who had accepted. Also tickets should be sent to other

members who are most likely to come. It was also decided to write to the Police and warn them that this Dance is private and interlopers be apprehended. It was proposed Mr. James and seconded Mr. Seward that Mr. John Hockley be approached to M.C. the Dance*. Mr. Norris proposed that a raffle be held at the Dance - all members interested be asked to contribute to prizes. This was recorded by Mr. Madsen*.

It was decided that a Football Match v The School be held on Saturday 8th March 1958 - A Committee Meeting will follow the match at 6 p.m.

It was proposed by Mr. James and recorded by Mr. Seward that it be recorded in the minutes that the Club is extremely grateful for all the work the present Secretary has done since appointment*.

*This was carried.

There being no other business, the meeting closed at approximately 9 p.m. with a vote of thanks to the Chairman and also thanks to Mr. James for his hospitality. This was proposed Mr. Claydon and seconded Mr. Seward.

In the absence of Mr. Horsey, our President, it was unanimously agreed that Mr. Parker take the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted unanimously - there being nothing arising from these minutes, the third item on the agenda, the Buffet Dance, was then dismissed.

The Secretary reported that 150 Tickets had been purchased and it was decided to send off tickets to members who had asked for them and also to send tickets at the Secretary's discretion to other members, who, although they had not answered the earlier circular, might be interested in attending.

With regard to Spot Prizes for the evening, several members of the Committee offered various prizes for which the Secretary thanked them very much.

The Secretary informed the Committee that he would purchase half a dozen books of tickets for the raffle and book-room, and also see that a placard be displayed at the entrance of the Dance Hall, stating that the Dance ~~was~~ is "PRIVATE".

at 7.30 p.m.

In the absence of Mr Horsey, our President, it was
unanimously agreed that Mr. Jones take the Chair for the
evening.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and
adopted unanimously.

Arising from the minutes, the Chairman commented on
the splendid Buffet Dance held in April last with hearty
endorsement from all Committee Members present. With regard
to the news letter, this item, the Chairman stated would be
dealt with later in the meeting. A successful Cricket Match
was played at the School during the summer - with a
win for the Old Boys.

The first item on the agenda, the News Letter, was
then discussed. The Secretary informed the meeting that
although he had accumulated numerous information concerning
Old Boys and their activities, he did not feel it was
warranted to circulate a News Letter until more information
was received. It was decided to send a News Letter
out after the A.G.M when more members may be
able to supply additional facts concerning Old Boys.

The Secretary raised the question of printing and Mr. Duttal kindly volunteered to provisionally enquire with his employers the possibility of printing the News Letter.

The second and third items on the were combined by the Chairman and it was proposed Madren and recorded Norris that the A.C.M 1958 follow immediately after the usual dinner at the Green Man Hotel on Saturday 29TH November 1958. It was decided that a football match be played v The School on the afternoon of the same day K.O. 2-30 p.m. It was then proposed Mr James and recorded Duttal that the following paragraph be included in the circular for the A.C.M :- "All Old Boys be asked to supply any information about themselves or other Old Boys for inclusion in the forth-coming News Letter".

The next item on the agenda concerned the Buffet Dance, 1959, after the success of the previous function, Mr. Duttal immediately proposed that the Dance be held at the Memorial Hall, Sawbridgeworth on Saturday 18TH April 1959. This proposition was recorded by Mr Norris and unanimously agreed. The Secretary said he would go ahead with the usual arrangements of booking Hall and Band etc.

Having dealt with all items on the agenda, the meeting turned to Any Other Business and Mr Jones, our Chairman, informed the Committee that he had received a letter from an old boy in South Africa containing interesting information concerning the History of The School. This letter was left in the hands of the Secretary and would be published in the News Letter.

The question of Old Boys ties was again raised and it was proposed Mr. James and Seconded Mr. Madsen that 4 dozen ties be purchased from Messrs. Henry Taylor of Walthamstow. This was unanimously agreed.

There being no other business the meeting closed at approximately 8.30 p.m. with a vote of thanks to the Chairman and also many thanks to Mr. James for his hospitality unanimously agreed.
