Minutes of the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1989

The President opened the meeting and welcomed all those attending. He hoped that more of the absentees would attend in the future.

The Secretary read the Minutes of the 1988 Annual General Meeting. These were duly agreed and signed as being a true record.

Mr. Porcher thanked the members for the bottle of champagne presented to him last year for his 80th birthday.

In the absence of the Treasurer, Michael Slater presented the Accounts for 1988/89, which showed a balance of £814.93.

There were no questions on the Accounts; their acceptance was proposed by Bill Billing and seconded by Robin Smith, with no dissensions.

This was followed by the election of the Treasurer and Secretary, who were both re-elected. This was proposed by Peter Cottee and seconded by Charles Tucker and carried unanimously. The remainder of the Committee was re-elected en bloc by popular consent.

The perennial subject of the cups was then raised by Roger Keningale, who suggested that, in order to keep the name of Harlow College alive, the Old Harlovians should present one of the cups to St. Nicholas' School, which was started in 1936 by Miss Joan Horsey, niece of E. P. Horsey. He had had some discussion with the new Headmaster, who had said he would be only too pleased to accept. Much discussion followed. Colin Porcher suggested that the Headmaster and Assistant Headmaster should be invited to next year's Old Harlovians Dinner, so that

they could select the cups they wanted. This was thought by some other members to be inadvisable as it would inhibit free speech from the membership on the subject. David Fish, who is a Governor of the school, was asked to approach the Headmaster to find out exactly what was required. It was thought that an older cup would be more appropriate, but the discussion ranged from presenting no cups at all to all of the existing cups; a suggestion of a new cup to be presented to St. Nicholas' School from the Old Harlovians Club was also put forward.

Robert Collins then proposed that the Headmaster of St. Nicholas be given the choice of up to three of the cups held by the Old Harlovians. Bill Billing proposed an amendment that such a decision should only be accepted if it was unanimously agreed. This amendment was passed, and Robert Collins' proposal was accepted unanimously. It was then left to the Committee to take the necessary action. The question of the ownership of the cups was raised and it was stated by the President that Miss Johnson, on the death of Mrs. Dames, gave the cups to the Old Harlovians Club to deal with as they saw fit.

The next item on the agenda was the venue for the next meeting. It was suggested that in 1990 the A.G.M. and Dinner should be held at St. Johns Art and Recreation Centre, the only snag being the difficulty in parking. This suggestion was proposed by Robin Smith and seconded by Bill Billing and agreed to by the meeting. The date was set for the 12th May 1990. It was also stated that the standard of the evening must be kept up.

Any Other Business

- 1. It was suggested that the Minutes of the Old Harlovians Club from 25 years ago should be read out each year.
- 2. The Secretary was asked to send a letter of condolence to David Brett, whose wife had been tragically killed in a car accident.
- 3. A vote of thanks was proposed to the Committee.

As there was no further business, the President closed the meeting at 11.30 p.m.
