

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at the St. Johns Arts and
Recreation Centre on Saturday 14 May 1994

40 Members attended the Meeting.

Before the Meeting commenced the Secretary drew Members' attention to the banner, which had now been modified, as the maroon border had been omitted originally. Its appearance met with universal approval.

In the absence of the Acting Chairman, Roger Pyle, the Treasurer, Michael Slater, was asked to chair the Meeting this year.

1. The Minutes of the 1993 A.G.M., having been circulated to all Members, were taken as read. Their adoption was proposed by Stan Porcher and seconded by Robert Collins. There were no matters arising.

2. The Treasurer reported that the income for the year ended 28 February 1994 totalled £1183.88, with a total expenditure of £890.64, giving a total balance of £1632.35. £448.55 of this money is reserved in the Donations Account (see note at end of Minutes). Stan Porcher proposed the adoption of the Accounts, which was seconded by Ian Loader.

3. Election of Secretary: Michael Dyke was proposed by Norman Pegrum and seconded by Norman Dellow. This was carried unanimously.

4. Election of Treasurer: Michael Slater was proposed by Peter Cottee and seconded by Tony White. This was carried unanimously.

5. Election of the Committee: The Committee was re-elected en bloc.

6. Plaque: As this matter has now dragged on for a number of years a proposal was made that a brass plaque, depicting the School badge and a few words to testify to the existence of the School, should be erected in the Chapel, excluding all reference to headmasters. This proposal met with universal approval and it is hoped to have some tangible evidence ready for next year's Reunion. If the names and dates of the headmasters were to become available, a corresponding brass plaque could be put up.

It was also suggested that maybe a large photograph of the School could be hung somewhere in the building.

7. Lych-gate repairs: These have now been completed at a cost of about £450, of which £350 was earmarked from the O.H. funds as a contribution towards this cost, although it had been stressed that no liability for further maintenance of the lych-gate would automatically be accepted by us.

8. Badges: The Secretary had received many orders for lapel badges, tie-pins and cuff-links depicting the School badge. Peter Cottee said that he knew someone who would make blazer badges if enough people were interested. On a show of hands nearly half the Meeting expressed an interest, so this matter will be followed up.

9. The date of the next Meeting was fixed for Saturday, 13th May 1995, at the same venue, with John West as caterer.

10. Any Other Business: David Collins informed the Meeting that he had a full list of all the pupils in the School and their positions in the final examinations of the Summer Term 1941.

Peter Cottee then proposed a vote of thanks to the Secretary, and the official part of the Meeting closed at 9.45 p.m.

N.B. The final cheque presented to St. John's for the lych-gate appeal was for the impressive sum of £385.70, the increase being due to further donations. This was very gratefully received by the Secretary of St. John's.
