Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at the St. Johns Arts and Recreation Centre on Saturday 16th May 1992

49 Members attended the Meeting. As a brief introduction Roger Pyle, Chairman, welcomed the members present.

The Minutes of the 1991 A.G.M. had previously been circulated to everyone and were taken as read. Their acceptance was proposed by Stan Porcher, seconded by Edward Cheshire, and accepted by all who had attended that meeting.

It was proposed by Norman Pegrum and seconded by Stan Porcher that the Committee be re-elected en block. This was also carried unanimously.

Although a start had been made on the Banner, it was incomplete and therefore not seen by the Meeting. The Plaque in memory of the School and Headmasters had ground to a halt as information, especially on the early Headmasters, was difficult to obtain. A few suggestions for obtaining further information were made by the Meeting, e.g. Guildhall Library, Chelmsford County Hall, Harlow Parish Council, the Headmasters Conference, and the Independent Schools Association.

The date for the 1993 A.G.M. was set for 15th May at St. Johns Arts and Recreation Centre, with John West as caterer again.

Any Other Business: Robert Collins was thanked for supplying his Hadham Water and for keeping quiet about the cups. There being no other business the Meeting closed at 10.30 p.m.
