I was at Harlow College from 1950, when I was eight, until 1952, when I was ten. The boy I liked best and always contrived to sit next to was Michael Dyke, but the one I most admired was Simon Seward. I was to meet them both again, as well as Michael Slater and others, when I started going to the South-West Essex Technical College in January, 1958. Simon was the Vice-President of the Students' Union at the time (as I was to become, later). He had such a presence at Union meetings and debates I felt that he had a great future in front of him, but I have never been able to find out what has happened to him since.

I wasn't Vice President for long before I left college to go to Aberdeen University, and in 1965 I moved to Southampton to work for the Ordnance Survey as a cartographic draughtsman. I had long been interested in motor sport, and I wrote to the Secretary of the Wessex Motor Club, which was based in that area. To my surprise I received a reply from Mike Dixon, who remembered me from my days at Harlow College!

Throughout the 1970s I devoted my life to the production of a series of guides to views from mountain-tops and other places. In the 1980s I devoted my life to books about Dorset and East Anglia, and since 2003 I have devoted my life to the revision of the Lakeland guides and other books by Alfred Wainwright.
